

Erin Heffner's Bio

Erin Heffner currently teaches Physical Education and coaches both volleyball and basketball at Berry Middle School. This past season the Berry volleyball team placed 2nd in the Metro Volleyball tournament, the highest any team has ever finished while at Berry. Heffner was also named the Metro Volleyball Coach of the Year.

Prior to Berry Middle School, Heffner was the assistant volleyball coach at the University of Montevallo for three seasons and was at Samford University, where she served as an assistant coach for two seasons.

A native of Fort Wayne, Ind., Heffner enjoyed a stellar playing career, while playing for former UM coach Judy Green at the University of Alabama. A two-time Honorable Mention All-American, she became the first UA player to be named All-SEC all four years of her career. She was named to the First Team All-SEC her junior and senior seasons and was a Second Team All-SEC selection as a freshman and sophomore.

Heffner was the AVCA South Region Freshman of the Year in 2001 and was a two-time First Team All-Region selection. A team co-captain her junior and senior seasons, Heffner started in 126 matches and posted 53 double-doubles. Her name is etched firmly in the UA record book, as she is listed in the Top 10 in several career offensive and defensive categories.

Heffner received her Master's Degree in Education in 2010 from the University of Montevallo and a Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice in 2005 from the University of Montevallo.
